What do municipalities do and how will their role change in the future?

- Finland's municipalities play a vital local government role, fostering participation and democracy at local level.
- The municipalities perform a range of functions laid down by law and other functions that are related to their self-governing status and decided by their residents.
- Each municipality takes decisions on a wide range of local matters closely affecting the lives of its residents.
- The municipalities arrange a significant proportion of basic public services, such as education, sports and fitness services and cultural services.
- The highest decision-making body in a municipality is the municipal
 council. The council is elected in municipal elections once every four years.
- The municipal council takes decisions on matters concerning the municipality's activities and finances.
- The functions and role of municipalities will change during the coming term of the municipal councils. This is due to the regional government reform, establishing a new level of government: the counties. In the future, health and social services will be organised by the new counties.
- Health and social services will be transferred from the municipalities to the counties in 2019.
- Despite changes in the role of the municipalities, they will still be responsible for a range of key basic services important to their residents, and for the wellbeing of their residents and the vitality of the local area.

New Local Government Act

The new Local Government Act focuses especially on the following:

Sustainability

Municipal finances to be based on what is efficient and reasonable in the longer run.

Management

New management methods in local government to enhance economic efficiency.

Democracy

Improved scope for local residents to influence matters and greater interaction with decision-makers.

Flexibility

Municipalities can introduce solutions tailored to their needs.

New practices

Increase in online services and easier cooperation between municipalities..
